## Karzai, Manmohan discuss wide-ranging issues

NEW DELHI: Visiting Afghanistan President Hamid Karzai held talks on several subjects with Prime Minister Manmohan Singh here on Thursday. "Generally everything was discussed. All issues, economical and political, were discussed," said sources in the government.

Mr. Karzai was here to address the inaugural session of the Delhi Sustainable Development Summit earlier in the Pratibha Patil.

On the political side, both sides took stock of the current situation, especially the reaching out by Pakistan to the Northern Alliance leadership and India's overtures to the Pashtuns. They noted the timetable for the withdrawal of foreign security forces and the raising of the Afghan police and the Army.
