

Mr Sanjivi Sundar is currently a Distinguished Fellow at The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) and Emeritus Professor in TERI University. He is also a member of a three member empowered committee set up by the Supreme Court of India to monitor road safety in the country.

Mr Sundar has had a distinguished career in the Civil Service in India and has held several senior positions in the State of Gujarat and in the Government of India.

He has since 1997 led TERI's work in the area of transport and has focused on promoting sustainable urban transport in India's cities. He has spoken at several national and international conferences on transport and its impact on energy, environment and climate change. He was a member of the High Level National Transport Development Policy Committee set up by the Government of India to draw up a policy for meeting the transport demands by 2032 in a sustainable manner.

Mr Sundar has also contributed significantly to TERI's work in the area of Regulation and Governance, and has written extensively in newspapers and refereed journals focusing on measures to strengthen and deepen regulatory reform. He has co-authored a book 'Framework of Independent Regulation' and has co-edited a book on Regulatory Law in Practice. He was a Distinguished Visiting Professor at the Faculty of Law, University of Toronto, where he delivered a series of lectures on 'Regulatory Reform and Governance'.

Mr Sundar also leads TERI's work in the area of Sustainable Urban Development and Governance. He was the advisor on the project "Towards the sustainable provision of basic urban services", and was also instrumental in getting TERI recognized by the Ministry of Urban Development as a Centre of Excellence in the area of Urban Development and Governance.
