

Gabrielle Dreyfus

Gabrielle Dreyfus is Senior Scientist at the Institute for Governance & Sustainable Development, and Head of Policies, Standards and Programs for the Kigali Cooling Efficiency Program, a philanthropic program housed at the ClimateWorks Foundation that aims to support developing countries to integrate energy efficiency into the refrigerant transition. Previously she served as the Deputy Director of the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of International Climate and Clean Energy, where she led international initiatives and campaigns to strengthen and scale clean energy policy through the Clean Energy Ministerial. Before joining DOE, she supported the scientific response to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill and development of a scientific integrity policy at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. As a Congressional Science Fellow in the U.S. Senate, she advised on energy and climate issues. She received a doctorate in Geosciences from Princeton University and the University of Pierre and Marie Curie for her research reconstructing climate change history from Antarctic ice core records.
